This issue of SEARCH features the following four papers:

The first article by Sharafa Dauda and Nik Norma Nik Hasan looks at how Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) are framed in Malaysian online newspapers. They compare the coverage given to SDGs in both mainstream and alternative online news portals.

The second article by Ramachandran Ponnann, Antoon De Rycker, Yang Lai Fong and Mohammad Abeer Syed examines violent movies and their influence on young Malaysian Indians. The study acknowledges that violence has become an integral part of Indian movies and hence explores if it does trigger aggressive behaviour among Malaysian Indian youths.

The third article by Sahar Shekaliu, Siti Ezaleila Mustafa, Hamed M. Adnan and Jarret Guajardo explores how a small-scale volunteer organisation uses Facebook to engage the Malaysian public in volunteer work. The paper specifically looks at Let's Tutor a Refugee Child, one of the major Facebook groups, which serves as a gateway to connecting volunteer tutors to refugee children.

The fourth article by Teoh Hee Chong and Yap Teng Teng examines the effects of experiential learning practices on teaching perception and learning approaches among public relations students. This study was fueled by the current lack of inadequate critical inquiry and evaluative skills among PR practitioners.

We hope you find the articles interesting and inspiring to explore new areas for future research. We would like to thank the authors for their contributions. Equally, we would like to express our thanks to the reviewers and the Editorial Board for their invaluable feedback that has been central to the continued publication of a journal of quality.
